Jessica Keith is the Head Softball Coach at Northeast Texas, and has been in the college ranks for 12 years. Jessica began her coaching career at Ranger College, guiding the Rangers to 5 consecutive post-season appearances and in her final year at Ranger capturing the first conference championship in 13 years. After Ranger shereturned to her Alma Mater, Northeast Texas Community College, guiding the Eagles to back-to-back regional tournament appearances in her first two years. As a collegiate coach she coached numerous All-Conference, All-Region and All-American players, including one Region 5 Player of The Year.

Jessica began her softball career in Eastland and was a member of the inaugural softball team at Eastland High School. As a Maverick, she was 3 time MVP, 2 time district player of the year and numerous all district awards. Jessica was a member of the elite gold travel team Texas Power and in 1996, played against the first ever USA Olympic softball team. She played against the likes of Lisa Fernandez, Dot Richardson, Michelle Smith and Jennie Finch. Jessicathen began her collegiate career at Northeast Texas, where she was two-time all-conference and all-region player. After Northeast she transferred onto The University of Louisiana - Monroe to finish her collegiate career. She also spent three summers playing the European circuit with collegiate players from Texas, touring England, France, Holland and Germany. Her final year playing professionally was in Holland, for the Dutch team Robur 58'.

Coach Keith spends her summers recruiting some of the top juco players in Texas, by working numerous camps and clinics throughout the state and attending top tournaments. She is excited about working with the young players in her hometown and hopes to give back what the sport has given to her.
